

Assessment and PTM Strategy

Assessments at Tahfiz International School are designed to support learning and monitor student progress in both Islamic and academic domains.

Types of Assessments:

- Formative Assessments: Regular classwork, oral recitations, quizzes, and teacher observations.- (15 marks)
- Summative Assessments: End-of-term exams, project presentations, and practical demonstrations, Class test etc.(85 marks)
- Tahfiz Progress: Regular hifz testing, revision evaluations, and fluency assessments.

Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs):

- Held once per term, PTMs are a vital opportunity to discuss your child's progress, strengths, and areas of support.
- PTMs include both academic and hifz updates, with input from subject teachers and the Tahfiz team.
- Parents are encouraged to attend PTMs regularly and engage in follow-up strategies at home.
- Detailed report cards are shared after each term, supported by verbal and written feedback.

Field Trips and External Activities

Field trips are an essential part of experiential learning at Tahfiz International School. They are carefully planned to align with curricular goals and Islamic values.

Types of Field Trips:

Parental Involvement and Consent:

- Parents will receive detailed trip information and a consent form in advance.

Drop-Off Policy

- School gates open according to the above schedule
- Students must be dropped off at the designated area only and escorted by staff into the building
- Parents are requested not to linger at the gate to avoid traffic congestion.

Pick-Up Policy

- Students will be released only to authorized guardians listed in school records.
- If there is a change in pick-up person, written notification or a phone call to the admin office is required.
- Late pick-ups of more than 30 minutes may incur a supervision fee.



Late Arrival and Early Dismissal Policy



Late Arrival:

Students are expected to arrive according to the following chart. A student arriving after this time will be marked LATE. Frequent lateness disrupts the learning process and may be followed up with parents if it becomes habitual.

Early Dismissal:

In the case of a student absence, parents must inform the school before 9:00 AM on the day of absence, stating the reason. An application is mandatorily required upon return. Absences due to illness last more than two days require a medical certificate.

Planned absences (e.g., travel) should be communicated well in advance for school approval. Missed work is the responsibility of the student to complete.

General Safety Guidelines:

- All visitors must report to the front office and wear a visitor badge.
- Emergency drills (fire, lockdown) are conducted regularly.
- Students are supervised during all school hours, including breaks and transitions.
- School premises are monitored by CCTV surveillance and security personnel.





Attendance & Absence Policies

Regular attendance is essential for a student's social, emotional, and academic development. Establishing a consistent routine helps children build a sense of structure and responsibility while making the most of their preschool experience. Below are our policies regarding attendance, absences, and tardiness.

Attendance Expectations

- All students are expected to attend school regularly.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring their child arrives at school on time each day.
- If a child will be absent, parents must notify the school office by 9:00 AM.
- A minimum attendance rate of 80% per term is required for children to maintain their enrollment and promotion to the next class.

Chronic absenteeism (more than 10 unexcused absences per semester) may result in a review of the child's enrollment status.

Tardiness & Late Arrivals

- Children arriving 15 minutes late than the arrival time are considered tardy.
- Parents must sign in late arrivals at the school office before the child is escorted to the classroom.
- Frequent lateness (5 or more occurrences per month) may lead to a parent meeting to discuss solutions for improving attendance.

If a child arrives after 9:30 AM without prior notice, they may not be admitted for the day unless there is a valid reason (e.g., medical appointment etc.).

Reporting Absences

- Parents must call the school office before 8:00 AM to report an absence.
- If a child is absent for more than three consecutive days, a doctor's note may be required for medical-related absences.
- If a child is absent for more than two weeks without communication, their spot may be forfeited and given to a child on the waiting list.
- An application is mandatorily required upon return.
- Planned absences (e.g., travel) should be communicated well in advance for school approval.
- Missed work is the responsibility of the student to complete.



Health & Wellness Policies



Our policies help create a safe, clean, and supportive environment for all children.

Illness Policy When to Keep Your Child at Home

Children must stay home if they have:

- Fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher (must be fever-free for 24 hours without medication to return).
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Unexplained rash, pink eye, or contagious illness such as chicken pox, lice.
- Persistent cough, difficulty breathing, or flu-like symptoms.

If your child is absent for 3+ days due to illness, a doctor's note is required. Students will return upon the full recovery.

Medication Policy

Prescription medications require a Medication Authorization Form from a doctor. All medication must be in its original packaging and handed directly to a staff member. No medication (including cough drops) should be left in a child's backpack

Guidelines



At Tahfiz International School, we believe in the balanced and purposeful use of technology to enhance learning while safeguarding our students' focus, well-being, and Islamic values.

For Students

- Mobile phones and personal devices are not permitted during school hours unless specifically approved for educational use.
- Any devices brought for learning purposes must be used under teacher supervision and returned to designated storage after use.
- Unapproved use of devices, including texting, gaming, or social media access during school hours, is strictly prohibited and may lead to confiscation.
- The school reserves the right to monitor and regulate the use of digital tools to ensure alignment with our values.

For Parents

- We encourage parents to limit screen time at home, especially during school days, and to monitor digital content to protect children from inappropriate material.
- Parents are encouraged to foster responsible digital citizenship and guide their children to use technology constructively.
- For our elementary section students we recommend "ZERO" hours of Digital device usage. The Primary and lower secondary section can use Digital devices but not more than 30 minutes a day.



Dress Code & Personal Belongings Policy

At Tahfiz International School, our dress code is designed to reflect modesty, discipline, and respect for Islamic principles. Uniformity in appearance promotes a sense of belonging, minimizes distractions, and reinforces the values we uphold as an Islamic educational institution.



General guideline

- Students must arrive at school neatly dressed in the prescribed school uniform every day.
- Uniforms must be clean, ironed, and well-maintained at all times.
- All students are expected to wear their uniforms with dignity and modesty, in accordance with Islamic guidelines.
- No alterations to the uniform design are allowed unless approved by school administration for medical or religious reasons.
- School badges, if any, must be properly sewn or displayed.

Uniform for Boys

- Light brown full sleeved kurta with school logo on pocket, dark brown trousers, black shoes and white socks.
- For Winter: Dark brown pullover (full/half sleeved)

Uniform for Girls

Pre-school: (Playgroup to Std. II)

- Light brown frock (below knee) with school logo on sleeves, dark brown trousers, black shoes and white socks
- For Winter: Dark brown pullover (full/half sleeved)

Std. III - Std. X

 Light brown complete abaya with school logo on sleeves, dark brown trousers, black shoes and white socks.





- Clothing with inappropriate images, logos, or slogans.
- Jewelry or accessories that pose a safety risk (e.g., dangling earrings, long necklaces).
- Costumes or dress-up clothes (except on designated theme days).
- Shoes with wheels, flip-flops, or heels.

Personal Belongings Policy

Items to Bring Daily

- Backpack
 large enough for a lunchbox, extra clothes (for pre-school), and schoolwork
- Reusable Water Bottle labeled with the child's name
- Lunch & Snacks box labeled with the child's name

Items Not Allowed at School

- Toys from home
 except for special sharing days, no toys or other home
 belongings must be brought.
- Electronic devices tablets, smartwatches, phones
- xpensive or sentimental items
 the school is not responsible for lost or damaged items

By following this dress code and personal belongings policy, we ensure that all children feel safe, comfortable, and prepared for a fun and active day at school.

For escalated concerns or strategic discussions, parents may request appointments with Admin Officer. SMT is available for meeting every working day from 11am to 12 noon.

Parent-Teacher Conferences

Grievance and
Complaint
Procedure (Step-byStep)



We are committed to listening to concerns and resolving them in a fair and respectful manner. Here is our step-by-step grievance resolution process:

• Step 1: Classroom-Level Concern

- Approach the class teacher via appointment or written communication.
- Most concerns are resolved at this level through dialogue.

• Step 2: Academic or Behavioral Escalation

 If unresolved, request a meeting with the Academic Coordinator for further review.

• Step 3: Administrative Resolution

• For broader concerns, meet with the SMT/ Principal through a scheduled appointment.

• Step 4: Written Grievance Submission

- If the issue remains unresolved, submit a formal written complaint to the school office or email it to tahfizinternationalschool@gmail.com
- A response will be provided within 5 working days, followed by an investigation and resolution plan.

All grievances are treated with confidentiality, professionalism, and fairness.



Withdrawal and Transfer Policy



• Withdrawal:

- Parents must submit a written withdrawal notice at least one month in advance.
- All dues (tuition, library books, resources) must be cleared before the Transfer Certificate (TC) is issued.

Transfer to Another School:

- Upon withdrawal approval, the school will provide a Leaving Certificate and Student Progress Report upon request.
- For international transfers, please notify the school early to allow for required documentation.

Note:

- Mid-term withdrawal does not qualify for a refund of tuition fees.
- Students may be requested to complete an exit interview to support school improvement.



FAQs

1. What time does the school start and end?

School begins at 7:45 AM and ends at 3:30 PM from Monday to Friday. Students are expected to be punctual and attend the daily assembly.

2. Is there a school uniform, and how can we purchase it?

Yes, all students must wear the designated school and Tahfiz uniforms.
Uniforms can be purchased from the school office.

3. What should I do if my child is absent?

Parents must inform the school by 9:00 AM on the day of absence via phone call. A written note or medical certificate may be required for extended absences.

4. Can I meet my child's class teacher or subject teacher?

Yes, but all meetings must be arranged by appointment. Please contact the school admin or write in the student's communication book to request a time slot.

5. Is homework assigned regularly?

Yes, homework is given in both academic and Tahfiz subjects. Parents are encouraged to monitor and support their child's homework schedule without doing the work for them.

6. How are assessments conducted?

We follow both formative and summative assessment strategies across academic and Qur'anic subjects. Assessment schedules and criteria are shared in advance. Feedback is provided through PTMs and progress reports.

7. What is the school's mobile phone policy?

Students are not allowed to bring mobile phones or smart devices unless officially permitted for academic use. Unauthorized devices will be confiscated and returned to parents only.

8. Does the school provide lunch or snacks?

Parents are required to pack a healthy lunch and water bottle for their child. Junk food, sugary drinks, and sharing of food are discouraged.

9. Are extracurricular and enrichment programs available?

Yes, we offer a variety of clubs, competitions, and enrichment activities such as Qur'an competitions, public speaking, science fairs, and Islamic arts, held throughout the year.

10. How do I stay informed about school updates?

All important notices are shared through Google Classroom, printed circulars, and emails. Please ensure your contact details are up-to-date.

11. What should I do if my child becomes ill during school hours?

You will be contacted immediately by the school nurse or admin. Please ensure that emergency contact numbers are always current. Students with contagious conditions must remain at home until recovery.

12. Can parents volunteer at school events?

Absolutely! We welcome parent volunteers for school events, trips, and classroom enrichment sessions. Interested parents can sign up through the admin office.

13. Are there any field trips or excursions?

Yes, educational and recreational field trips are planned throughout the year. Consent forms and detailed information will be sent in advance.

14. What happens in case of late pick-up?

Students must be picked up within 30 minutes after school ends. Late pick-ups may result in supervision fees or require a meeting with school administration if repeated.

15. How can I address a concern or complaint?

Start by speaking with the class teacher. If unresolved, escalate to the academic coordinator, then to the Vice Principal or Principal. Written complaints can be submitted to the admin for formal resolution.

16: Can my child bring toys or gadgets to school?

A: No personal toys or digital gadgets are allowed unless specified for class use.

Guideline for Parents at a Glance

- 1. Parents are requested to check and sign diaries regularly.
- 2. Parents are requested not to give gifts to teachers or any other member of staffs.
- 3. Parents are requested not to approach teachers with requests of private tutoring.
- 4. Celebrating birthdays is not an Islamic practice. Parents are requested not to send birthday cards to school or involve teachers in birthday celebrations.
- 5. Copies will be sent home regularly to enable the parents to know about their child's progress. Please sign the copies sent to ensure that your child does his/her corrections and return them the following day.
- 6. Please ensure that your child does his/her homework regularly and brings all necessary books and equipment to school.
- 7. Establish Islam in your daily life.
- 8. You are earnestly requested to ensure that all school rules are observed. In the case of infringement of school rules, the school reserves the right to take such action as deemed necessary by the school. This may include withdrawal or expulsion of any student from the school.
- 9. Parents are requested not to approach the school with requests of change of factual information after the student has been admitted.
- 10. Parents are requested to lodge their complaints formally through the school office. The school adopts a 'zero tolerance' policy towards disruptive behavior and abusive language.
- 11. Students may be detained after school to complete unfinished work or as punishment for any infringement of school rules. Parents will be notified in advance regarding detention by means of the detention slip. Parents are requested to sign and return the slip the following day.
- 12. Regularly remind your child that all good deeds are to be done with the intention of pleasing Allah and we refrain from bad actions fearing His displeasure.
- 13. Make sure your child has a proper amount of sleep every night.
- 14. Make sure your child eats a good breakfast before coming to sch<mark>ool.</mark>
- 15. Send healthy Tiffin.
- 16. Keep informed of holidays and school events.
- 17. Encourage your child to be an independent learner.
- 18. The academic session is divided into two terms. Progress repo<mark>rts are given at</mark> the end of each term. Parents- Teacher meetings are held twice each term.
- 19. Report cards will be given only to parents or authorized persons Authorization must be given by the parents in writing.
- 20. Report cards will not be issued earlier than the specified date Late collection of Report Cards should be from the office.
