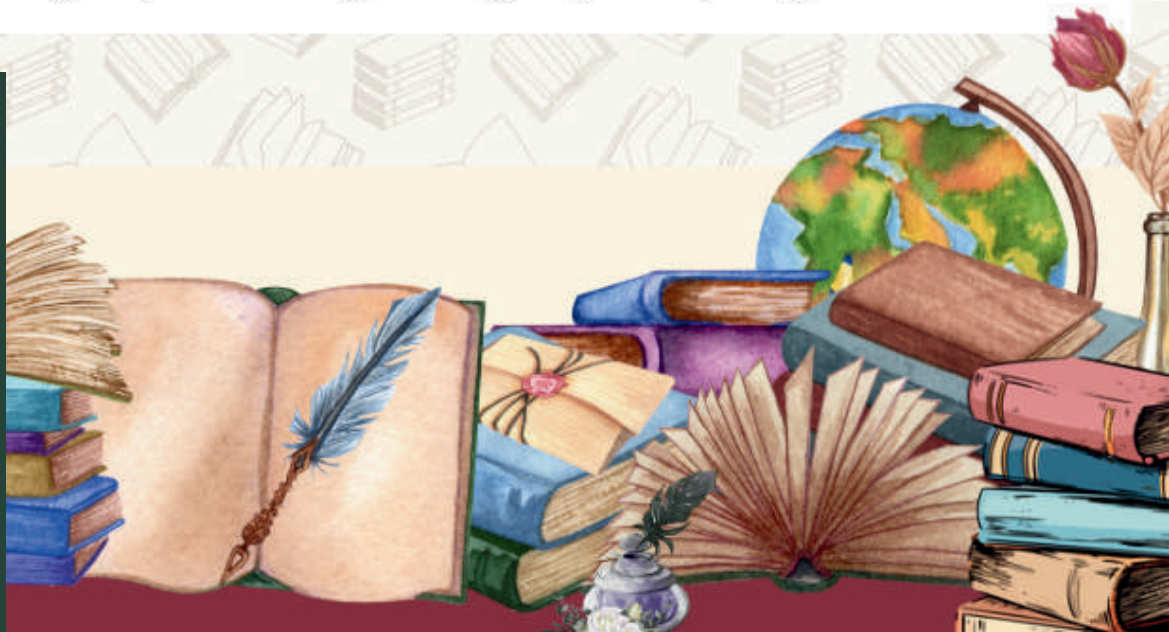

From Playgroup to Grade 7, each child found their stage. One might say: “English Week is not about English alone—it’s about voices finding their wings!”



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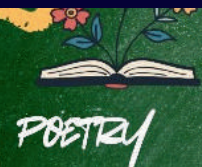


About The Event

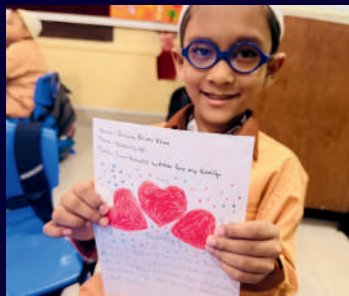
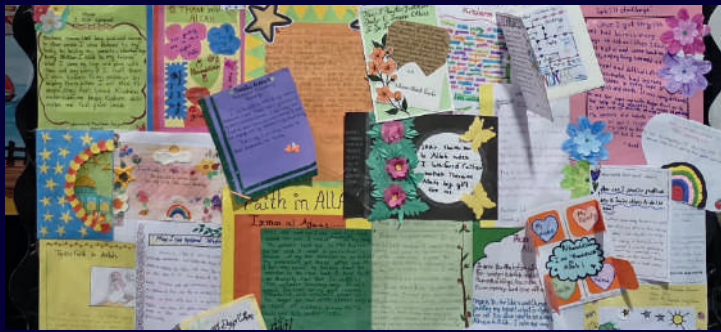

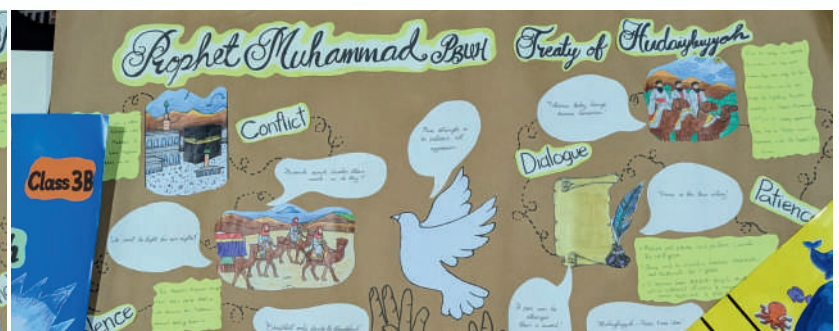
Posters that Speak: Literature Inspired by the Qur'an

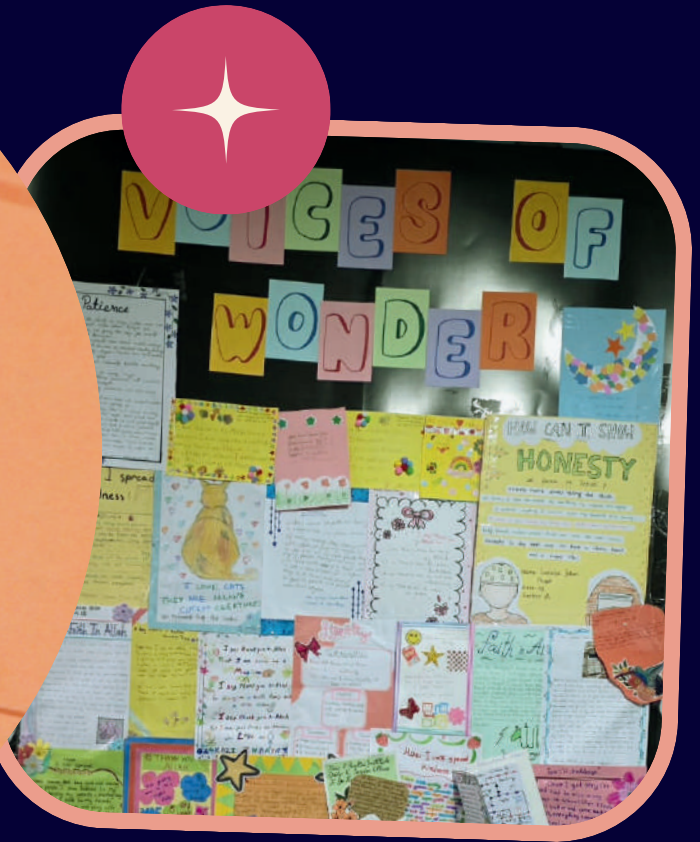

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TEACHER'S TALK

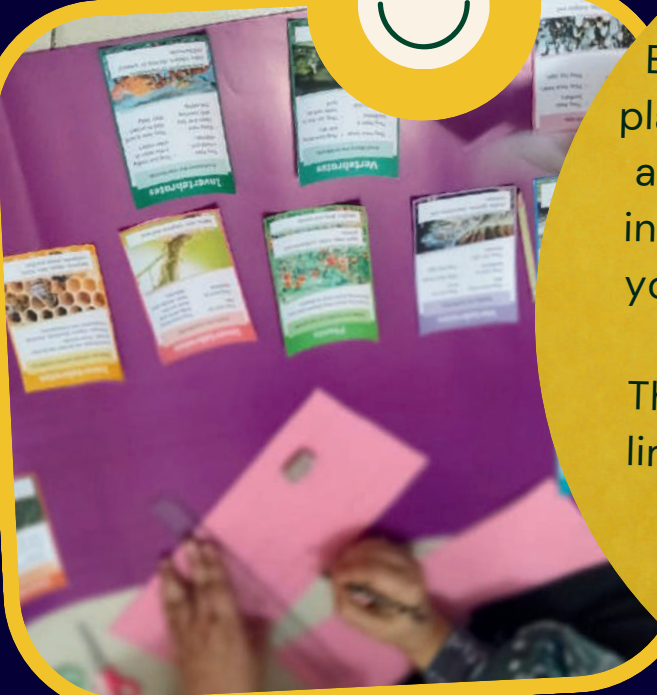
The magic of words
